Francesca Smiraglia has designed a decorative and architectural ceiling light for Kundalini. **Dala**, which means **petal** in an ancient southern Indian language, conjures up the **movement of a corolla that embraces the light**. The two outer metal casings in different sizes wrap around the large diffuser, overlapping like the petals of a flower. **Fluid and dynamic lines** traced by the two textured elements, creates a refined chromatic contrast in different shades. The opal white diffuser emanates a **soft**, yet powerful light. The metal structure comes in different colours.
